Three supervisory roles

Coach

- Tries to improve performance and abilities
- Sets goals
- Provides advice on how to achieve goals

Counselor

 Helps employees address performance problems stemming from personal circumstances

Mentor

- Acts as a role model
- **Provides opportunities for personal and professional growth**

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Principles for coaching

- 1. Clarify your coaching role
- 2. Engage employees' interests and passions
 - Offer "stretch" assignments
- 3. Be a conversation partner
 - Have regular, frequent discussions about performance
- 4. Define business results
- 5. Clarify performance expectations

Principles for coaching (continued)

- 6. Build dynamic capability
 - Help employees prepare for change
 - Help employees learn to learn
- 7. Recognize "teachable moments"
- 8. Use multiple coaching media
- 9. Provide recognition and rewards

Ethics is "the practice of applying a code of conduct to day-to-day actions."



The toughest choices you will make as a supervisor are not between right and wrong but between right and right.

Characteristics of an ethical organization

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- Everyone treated with honesty and respect
- Frequent, open, honest, and compassionate communication
- Fair and competitive bidding procedures
- Fair and objective criteria for employee recruitment, hiring, evaluation, and promotion
- Confidentiality

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- Provision of needed training, resources, and supervision
- Reflection of honesty and integrity

- Considering appearances when making decisions about what to do
- Striving to do your best as a supervisor
- Publicly supporting your organization's decisions
