What is a Volunteer Friendly Visitor?



Help educate residents on their rights!

The Friendly Visitor
Program is part of the
South Carolina
Appalachian Council
of Governments'
Regional Long-Term
Ombudsman Program.
Volunteers are *not*certified Ombudsman,
but do help assist them
in their duties.

A Friendly Visitor is:

- A volunteer visitor in nursing homes and long-term care facilities
- Someone to educate residents and families about residents' rights
- Someone to assist residents in resolving minor concerns with the facility
- Someone to participate in resident and family council meetings
- Someone to bring concerns to the attention of the facility administrator and the regional volunteer coordinator

Who Can Become Friendly Visitor?

You can become a volunteer if you:

- Are 18 years of age or older
- Have a valid driver's license and transportation
- Have good verbal and listening skills
- Are able to maintain confidentiality
- Are free from conflict of interest (no family in the facility where you are placed as a volunteer)
- Agree to abide by the Ombudsman Code of Ethics
- Do not have a criminal record
- Do not use controlled substances

- To learn about the Long Term Care Ombudsman Program, Long Term Care facilities and residents
- To gain new skills or experience in the long-term care field
- To build social networks and make new contacts
- To enjoy the satisfaction of helping others through volunteer work

- To contribute to society in a positive way
